POSITION SUMMARY

Young people grow up in Washington surrounded by a thriving science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM)-based economy, yet they don't always receive the support they need to participate. Washington STEM is a statewide education nonprofit leveraging STEM for social change, removing barriers to credential attainment, and creating pathways to long-term economic security for systemically underserved students.

The Central Puget Sound Senior Program Officer will advance opportunity through STEM education and career pathways in Washington State's most populous region. The successful candidate will lead collective action efforts, working closely with other Washington STEM colleagues and regional Network leaders across the state.

PRIMARY RESPONSIBILITIES

- Lead Washington STEM's on-going efforts to establish a cross-sector, collective action network focused on STEM education and career pathways in King and Pierce Counties, home to more than 40 percent of Washington students
- Advance the key work streams of a Washington STEM Network, including:
 - organize and maintain a cross-sector network focused on creating system-level change related to Washington STEM's program areas (early learning, K-12, and career pathways), with initial work focused on early learning;
 - o co-create and support Washington STEM's policy and advocacy agenda;
 - \circ set goals and measure progress using available data and data systems
- Develop and advance initiatives that articulate and complement the work of other organizations in the region (including the Foundation for Tacoma Student's Tacoma STEAM Network; the Community Center for Education Results, Eastside Pathways, and King/Pierce Career Connect Washington Regional Network) and that are aligned with the work of Washington STEM's regional STEM Network system

- Represent Central Puget Sound as a part of the Washington STEM regional Network system, ensuring that resources, lessons learned, and best practices from other regions are localized in the Central Puget Sound region and that innovations in the Central Puget Sound ultimately benefit the other regions of our state
- Cultivate strong partnerships with and among Central Puget Sound organizations that serve Indigenous students, Black students, and other communities of color – especially organizations whose leadership and staff reflect the populations they serve
- Lead with data, centering people from Washington STEM's priority populations (in particular, Indigenous students, Black students, and students from other communities of color in the region)
- Within the region and the STEM Network community, lead on issues of racial equity and educational justice
- As a member of the program team, support the design and execution of program strategy and initiatives
- Cultivate strong partnerships with other internal teams at Washington STEM (impact, policy and advocacy; resource development and communications, and finance and operations) to achieve strategic plan goals
- Other duties as assigned
